FARRA D'ISONZO

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Nestled in the shadow of the Quarin, among rows of vineyards, Cormons features a refined historic centre of Habsburg heritage with elegant churches and monumental buildings to discover while strolling, such as the medieval part and the ancient *centa*, as the historic centre is called. The wine and traditional gastronomy are undeniable highlights.

A centre of Roman origins, it stands where the ancient Via Gemina crossed the Isonzo. The rich past is told in the Museum of Documentation of Friulian Peasant Civilisation. The area, at the southern foothills of the Collio, offers charming views of

vineyard-covered terraced estates called *ronchi*, the Alpine arc, the Karst, and the river.

A refined retreat protected by ancient walls erected by the Venetians against the Turks, featuring palaces that reflect four centuries of Austro-Hungarian influence. BETWEEN THE KARST AND THE SEA: THE NORTHERNMOST POINT OF THE MEDITERRANEAN



Culture, art, sport, and nature: the town's fortress symbolises its medieval origins alongside the archaeological area in the city centre. 20th-century history is preserved in the Great War Theme Park and the Shipbuilding Museum. The sports activities at Marina Julia and the nautical centres along the coast make it a vibrant and enchanting tourist

ROMANS D'ISONZO



LAND OF CULTURE, TRADITIONS, AND ARCHAEOLOGY

The Civic Archaeological Museum features finds from the Longobard necropolis, whose history is revived in a grand re-enactment each June. In November. the town comes alive with the centuries-old Santa Elisabetta Fair.

The village of Versa is the birthplace of Celso Macor and hosted the poet-soldier Giuseppe Ungaretti.

SAGRADO

HISTORY AND NATURE BETWEEN THE ISONZO AND KARST



Sagrado, including the villages of Poggio Terza Armata, San Martino del Carso, and Peteano, was a theatre of the Battles of the Isonzo between 1914 and 1917. In 1922. Mount San Michele was declared a Monumental Zone. Today, the museum complex

offers an immersive experience of the Great War events.

MEDEA

AMONG THE BEST-PRESERVED TOWNS OF AUSTRIAN FRIULI



Must-see sites include the Ara Pacis Mundi, a majestic monument to the fallen of all wars. A visit to the Colle Park and the Church of Sant'Antonio, located along the Cammino

celeste, the Celestial Way, is also recommended. Finally, the 343-step stone staircase from the early 19th century, fully restored in 2024, is impressive.

BETWEEN AGRICULTURE AND HISTORY

MORARO



Moraro boasts an agricultural tradition that places it among the rural municipalities of the Isontino area. Numerous tomb finds, still preserved in the Natural History Museum of Vienna, attest to the presence of a Longobard nucleus in the area, although the village already existed before. The toponym's origin is linked to the large number of morârs (mulberries) that grow here.

MOSSA

THE GATEWAY TO COLLIO. BETWEEN NATURE AND MUSIC



As an access point to the splendid cycling routes that cross Collio and Brda, visiting the historic Villa Codelli will allow you to enjoy the August Musical Evenings. In the Preval plain, the Marian sanctuary welcomes numerous visitors and hosts several concerts. In summer, the square comes alive with cultural events. The trattorias will let you savour excellent local products.

SAN CANZIAN D'ISONZO





A place rich in archaeology and ancient stories that tell tales of saints, basilicas, and martyrs. Situated on the left bank of the Isonzo, with the villages of Pieris, Begliano, and Isola Morosini-Terranova, it is also known for nature. food, wine, and hospitality. www.scoprisancanziandisonzo.org

A bilingual city, home to Trieste Airport and an important railway iunction. Sites to visit include the Roman rustic villa and the Antiquarium, along with several historic villas. It offers direct access to the Karst for hiking and cycling. www.ronchicultura.it

SAN LORENZO ISONTINO


IN THE HEART OF THE GORIZIA AREA



Nestled between the Collin hills and the Isonzo plain. it welcomes tourists with open arms, offering a picturesque natural landscape, a rich wine and food tradition, and renowned wineries. The Laghetti Rossi Municipal Park is an oasis of peace and quiet, and from the Picòl dal Dàgo along the Alpe Adria Trail, one can admire the surrounding panorama.

TURRIACO

THE HEART OF BISIACARIA

It features the 18th-century Church of San Rocco and Villa Tiberio Priuli, a 17th-century manor house, in Piazza Libertà. Along the Isonzo River is the municipal park, and a network of cycling routes named after famous

Italian songwriters. The Festa in Piazza and the Baccalà (Salted Cod) Festivals, held every September, and the Concezione Festival are well-known events.

SAN PIER D'ISONZO

NATURE AND HISTORY

Set in a pleasant rural landscape, the majestic bell tower of San Pietro Apostolo stands out. Other reasons to visit include the sports area. the Isonzo River (the tofi stone), Villa Prandi, the Children's Archaeological Museum, the Marian shrine on the Passo della barca - Boat Pass -, Mount

Sant'Elia, and the churches of San Zanut and Cassegliano.

STARANZANO

AN EXTRAORDINARY NATURAL **ECOSYSTEM**



A rural village in Roman times, it hosts the Foce dell'Isonzo Regional Nature Reserve, with the island of Cona. a destination for slow and experiential tourism. The cycle paths between Trieste and Venice intersect with the routes of ancient peoples, as evidenced by the Roman villa of Liberta Peticia. The town organises the centuries-old Sagra de le Raze and the Water Festival.

VILLESSE

AT THE CONFLUENCE OF THE **ISONZO AND TORRE**



It preserves traces of the ancient Romans (such as the imperial milestone markers displayed in the town hall) and the defensive fortifications of the Great War. The Church of San Michele. from the early medieval period, and the 17th-century Villa Coronini Ghersiach are the most prestigious architectural buildings.





AOUILEIA

WORLD HERITAGE SITE



Founded by the Romans in 181 BC and declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1998, it was one of the largest cities of the Roman Empire, one of the most vibrant communities of early Latin Christianity, and one of the most important ancient ports of the Adriatic, serving as a starting point for major commercial, cultural, and military routes towards North-Eastern Europe. It was the nominal seat of a bishopric and a patriarchate that was suppressed only in 1751, which, at its peak, went from Lake Como to Hungary. In 1921, the Unknown Soldier's body was chosen here. The area also boasts a two-thousand-year-old wine and gastronomic tradition, set against a backdrop of lush, unspoiled nature and the blue of its lagoon.

CIVIDALE DEL FRIULI

THE FIRST LONGOBARD DUCHY IN ITALY

It features groups of buildings included by UNESCO in the World
Heritage List with the serial site "The Longobards in Italy. Places of Power
(568-774 AD)": in the historic centre, you can visit the Monastery of Santa
Maria in Valle with its Tempietto Longobardo, the Christian Museum and
Cathedral Treasury, and the National Archaeological Museum. The town has a
20th-century painting collection hosted at the de Martiis Family Gallery in Palazzo de
Nordis, the 15th-century cathedral and the CIPS-Podrecca Signorelli International
Centre, dedicated to figure theatre. A must-visit is the famous Devil's Bridge, with its
breathtaking view of the Natisone River.

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PALMANOVA

THE STAR FORTRESS

A unique example of a city founded in a star shape that remains intact, Palmanova is one of the most important models of military architecture, with its layout consisting of three concentric rings of walls, two Venetian and one Napoleonic. It is possible to walk along the perimeter of the walls, admiring the majesty of the defensive works and the natural landscape. A network of tunnels runs through the fortifications, some of which are open for visits. In 1960, it became a National Monument, and since 2017 it has been a UNESCO World Heritage Site as part of "The Venetian Works of Defence between the 16th and 17th Centuries: Stato da Terra - Western *Stato da Mar*" and, since 2018, one of Italy's Most Beautiful Villages.

There are five UNESCO sites in Friuli Venezia Giulia: in addition to the archaeological area and the patriarchal basilica of Aquileia, the Venetian fortress of Palmanova, and the Longobard site of Cividale del Friuli, there is also the Palù di Livenza pile-dwelling site and the Dolomites area in the provinces of Pordenone and Udine. - www.turismofvq.it/en/art-and-culture/world-heritage-sites

Gorizia and Nova Gorica, collectively known as GO! 2025, are situated in an extraordinary region straddling Italy and Slovenia.
